career" was in teaching. While at UC Berkeley, as an art major, I wandered over to the architecture department. There, I was "taken" with the water color rendering classes and I took as many as I could. Because the veterans were returning to college after the war, classes were "overflowing". As a result, my teacher, Michael Goodman, asked me to be his teaching assistant. After graduation, I taught art in the Oakland Public Schools. My hus-

band, Bernie, was finishing his accounting studies at UC Berkeley, and we settled in Oakland. When our children, Sharon and Neal, started school, I went back to UC to study for my "third career" — architectural illustrations.

With so much building and development in the Bay area, I had many opportunities. After each detailed accurate illustration was finished, I had to find a

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way to "balance" — so I "broke out" in an oversized abstract! After several years, I retired and pursued the "career" I love today—"Plein Aire" style painting.

Painting in "Plein Aire" and capturing the southwest area has been a real challenge—Sedona, Arizona and

Santa Fe, New Mexico have been the subjects. The "red rock", the creeks and falls, the high desert, the canyons—all have been a real challenge! And lately, I "combed" the California coast. Children on the beach, coastlines, inlets, vineyards

and fields—are all wonderful subjects to explore!

My aim is to capture the "essence of place" with on-the-spot impressions water color sketches. Keeping these basic interpretations in finished oil paintings is the ultimate challenge. It is the driving force!

Exhibit Rules

CHAIR: John Mallon

RECEIVING: Friday, July 18, 2008 from 10 AM until 12 noon at the Presbyterian Church, 4101 Park Blvd., Oakland. Enter parking lot from Hampel Street.

JUROR: John Arbuckle

ACCEPTED WORKS: Pick up at the Presbyterian Church on Friday September 12th, 2008 between 10 AM and 12 noon.

ENTRIES:

Entries will be two dimensional; 16"x 20" min. and 36"x 36" max. Only 1 entry accepted per member.

Artworks depicting iconic scenes of San Francisco are not appropriate for this venue! If entered, artwork in this category may be rejected at the sole discretion of the show chairman.

Because only 7 "large" (i.e. over 24"X30") works can be displayed in the show space, only the first 7 "large" pieces will be accepted, unless specifically allowed by the Show Chair.

Works restricted to original work – no class work or copies.

Nudes and political statements are not accepted (venue requirement).

All work must be for sale.

The Chamber reserves the right to reject any work from the show for any reason.

Any work shown at a Chamber of Commerce Show **prior to** July 2005 may be shown again at this show. Any work having won a cash award in any OAA show is not eligible to receive another cash award but may receive a merit award.

To be entered as a single work, any grouping of 2 or more works must be mounted within a single frame which meets the overall size requirements.

ENTRY FEE: \$8.00 per entry.

FRAMING:

No wide (may not exceed 3") or elaborate frames will be accepted.

Mats must be clean and well cut.

Frames must be clean, sturdy and no protruding screw eyes or hangers will be allowed.

Works larger than 24" x 30" (if covered) must be under plastic instead of glass.

LABELS: Must be filled out completely and affixed to the upper left hand corner on the back of the entry.

PLEASE TYPE OR PRINT LEGIBLY!

AWARDS: First award \$100; Second award \$50; Third award \$25. Merit awards are given at the discretion of the Juror.

INSURANCE: A waiver must be signed on receiving day.

SALES:

All sales made during the show and/or 30days following the close of the show (if the work was seen by the buyer at the show) will be handled by the Sales Chairman Stan Cohen 510 533-3003.

OAA policy is that no change will be made in the price (in connection with this show) after the work is accepted.

Everyday objects elevated to a magical level just beyond the real world - this is the art of John Arbuckle. A shell, a flower, some gourds, a quince on a leafy branch all become luminous globes,

painted with many layers of glazes some in oil on canvas and some in watercolor on paper. I am passionate about light and shadow and the sensuous nature of objects and their relationships to each other. I also explore the idea of abstraction within reality when in the process of painting. It has been said that my work is very Zen, which I strive for in my art. The goal of my work is to slow the viewer down and take them to a quiet place away from the madness of day to day life.

John studied at the New York School of Visual Arts and received his B.F.A. in painting and printmaking from Pratt Institute, New York. Exhibiting throughout the United States over the past 34 years, Arbuckle has works in many private and public collections, including the Brooklyn Museum of Art, Kaiser Permanente, Lloyds of London, to name a few. He has also received numerous awards including Gold and Silver Art of California Discovery Awards.
